
In line with our official charter, impact in the following two major areas has been highlighted in this report:

SCHOLARSHIP AND EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT

The core mission of HOPE Foundation centers around granting scholarships to orphans and underprivileged students, enabling them to successfully pursue and complete their formal education. Since the year 2019, HOPE has been instrumental in disbursing scholarships totaling Rs. 372,591,865/-(Approximately \$1,862,959), benefiting over 5,500 students.

In the year 2023 alone, HOPE Foundation allocated and disbursed Rs. 96,875,112 (Approximately \$484,375) as part of the Promote and Support Education Program, positively impacting the ongoing educational journey of 4,647 students. This commitment reflects our dedication to fostering learning opportunities and empowering the next generation

EMERGENCY APPEAL PAKISTAN FLOODS PHASE 2

The unprecedented heavy rainfall across multiple provinces in Pakistan resulted in severe flooding, marking one of the worst floods in the country's history. More than 33 million people have been adversely affected, particularly in Interior Sindh, Southern Punjab, and Balochistan, which suffered substantial losses.

In collaboration with MAWA Trust, HOPE Foundation initiated immediate relief activities in the flood-affected regions of Southern Punjab, Interior Sindh, and Balochistan. During the initial phase, HOPE Foundation served over 8,000 families by providing 100,000 food packages, 9,500 mosquito nets, 575 tents, and 300 tarpaulins. Additionally, 40 free medical camps were established, benefiting more than 20,000 families.

In the second phase of relief activities, HOPE extended support to deprived flood-affected families through the construction of new houses and the repair of extensively damaged homes in Punjab, Interior Sindh, and Balochistan.

Notably, HOPE Foundation successfully built 148 new houses and repaired 36 houses, utilizing a total amount of Rs. 39,355,276. (Approximately \$196,776)


These efforts underscore HOPE's commitment to addressing the immediate needs and long-term recovery of communities devastated by the floods.

Mother of 4 HOPE Benefeciaries



We had gone to Turbat (Balochistan) for a job in a private college, Kech Grammar. We spent 7 to 8 years there. My husband used to receive threats there and told to leave Turbat. One day, we received the news that he was martyred.

He was a such a good soul, he was an angel in this world. When one has something (to offer), everyone is theirs. But when they have nothing, no one's there for them. I know how difficult it was. In what we've experienced and the difficulties we've faced. Men break their strength. I was a woman. I know what I faced as a woman. I spent time with great difficulty; it was very hard. I was unwell, I couldn't. There was no suit to sew for earnings.

When I was well, I could sew suits. Now, I'm not able to sew due to issues with my eyesight. HOPE Foundation has helped us a lot with regards to the children. My children, whatever station they've reached today is only due to them.

We contacted HOPE foundation for the purpose of education. Until my children were studying, we didn't have any issues with regards to fees. We didn't have information about the fees. We used to receive payment for their fees directly from HOPE foundation. They used to pay us monthly for expenses as well.

- My eldest daughter, Boshan Syeda, did her MBBS. After FCS, Hope Foundation started paying her fees.
- Then I have a son, studying software engineering in Faisalabad (in government college university). All his fees after FSc were also provided by HOPE Foundation.
- Then I have a daughter, Naeelain Syeda. She did her education in Ophthalmology medicine and Surgery at Al-Shifa, in Islamabad. All her fees were also paid by HOPE Foundation.
- The youngest one is Muntazir Syeda. She's done her MSc in Agriculture, from Faisalabad. Her fees were also given by HOPE Foundation.

Now all four of my children have completed their education. Some have already received their degrees. Thanks to Allah, our time is spent well now. I am thankful with what my children have and it brings me such joy when I see people's attitude.

Story of Doctor Sisters



When I was in grade 7, my father died.

After I become an orphan, we didn't have any means to continue our education. Sometimes we even had nothing to eat.

I got distinctive position in my matriculation exams. Thanks to Allah, I scored 1046 points (out of 1100) and secured first position in southern Punjab. I got accepted into King Edward medical university and my sister accepted into services institute of medical sciences.

HOPE foundation covered all our fees and all our other expenses. We are thankful to HOPE Foundation in obtaining our degrees.

Our mother feels very proud of her two daughters and I don't have words to pay tribute to HOPE Foundation.
